After reading and learning about pirates, the Pre-Kindergarten and Post-Kindergarten students made pirate hats and paraded around the school.





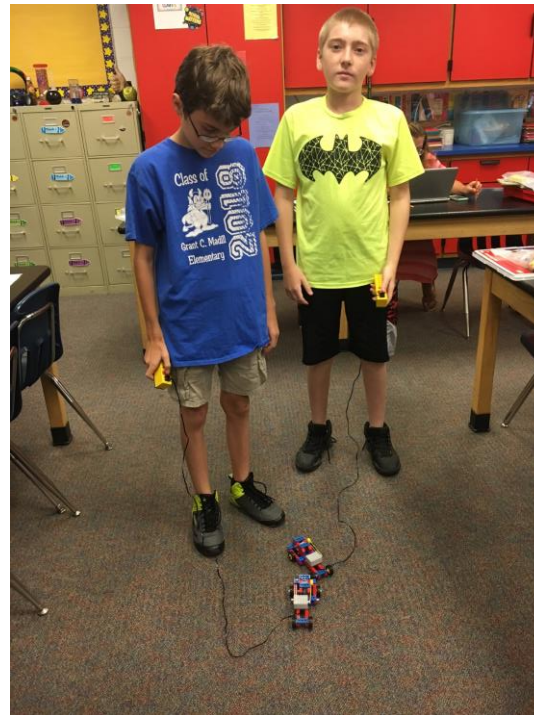

Post-Grade 5 and Post-Grade 6 students used LEGOs to build simple machines.





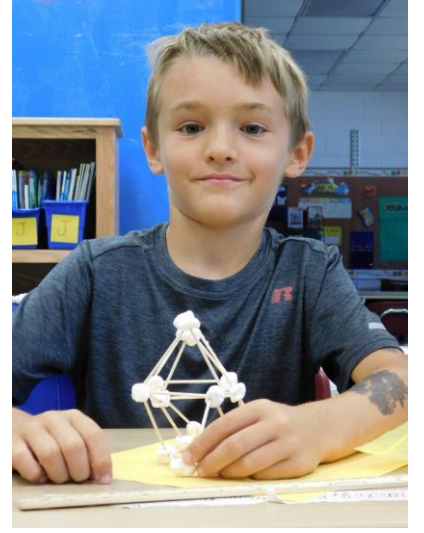

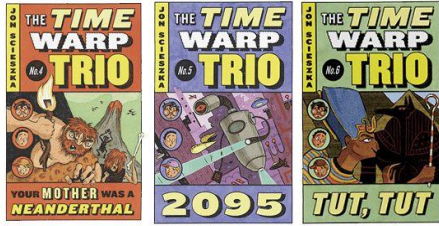

Then, they had the opportunity to create their own model volcano.







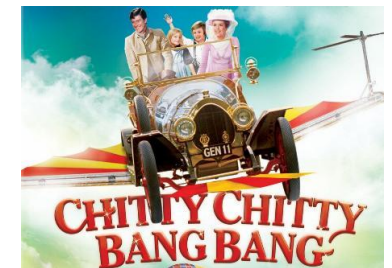
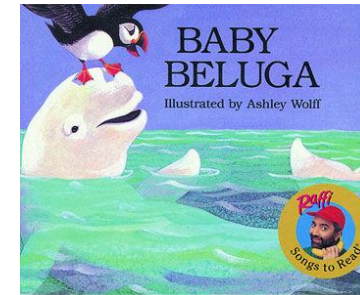

Pre-Kindergarten and Post-Kindergarten students participated in an indoor obstacle course.







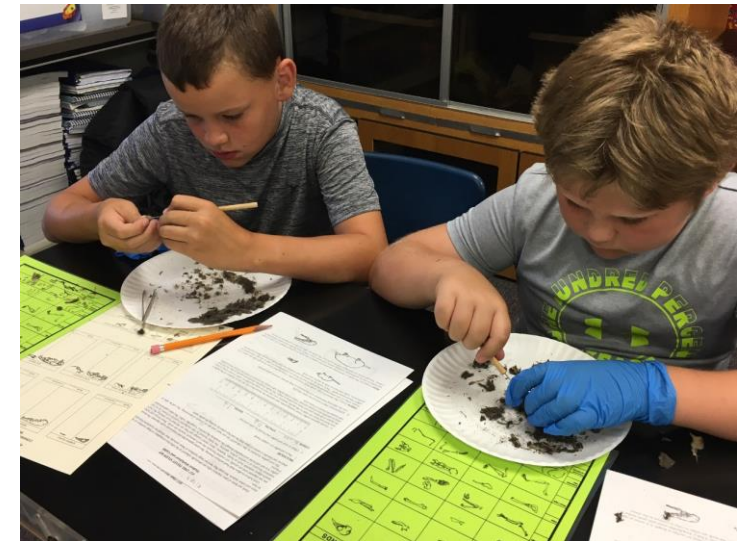
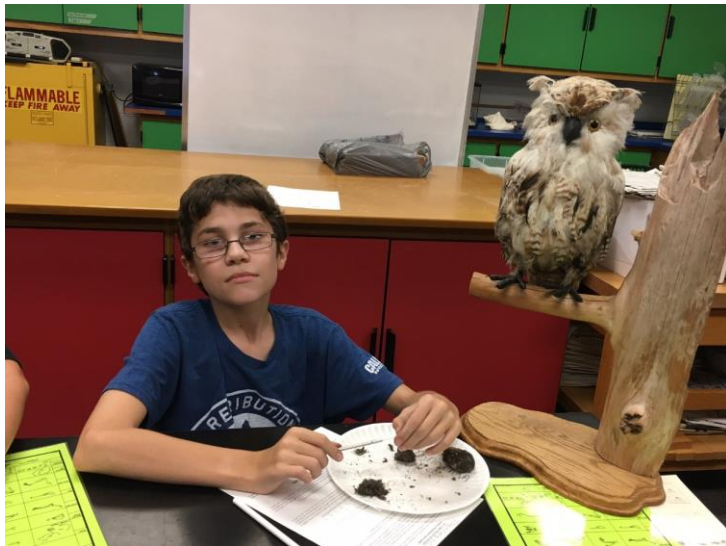
